MUNICIPAL ELECTION TUESDAY, MARCH 10TH

ALL VOTING will be held at the Municipal Building, Council Chambers, 59 Main Street. Voting hours are from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

May 9 - May 16, 2015
(Plus May 20 & 23)

Except Sunday and Monday

The landfill, located on Taylor Road off Outer Forest Avenue, will be open **FREE OF CHARGE** to Orono residents to **DROP OFF Spring Cleanup Items** from Saturday, May 9 through Saturday, May 16, 2014 (**except Sunday and Monday**) from 8:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m.

Two extra days have been added: Wednesday, May 20th and Saturday, May 23rd for your convenience. **Proof of residency or property ownership required.** (continued on page 8)



BAGGED LEAVES & BRUSH PICKED UP CURBSIDE

May 5 – May 22, 2015

The Town of Orono will begin picking up bagged leaves and brush on Tuesday, May 5 through Friday, May 22, 2015.

Bagged leaves should be placed curbside next to the brush and limbs. Piled **limbs** should be at least four feet, but not longer than eight feet in length. Limbs must be less than six inches in diameter. **Brush** should be neatly piled at curbside and limbs should be stacked with broadest diameter ends facing the curb.

No chunks of firewood, blocks of wood or stumps will be picked up.

Trash that is mixed with bagged leaves will not be picked up.





PRE-K & KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

The Asa Adams School will hold Pre-K & Kindergarten registration on Wednesday, March 18, 2015 from 3:15 p.m.- 6:30 p.m. Registration for the 2015-2016 school year for Pre-K and Kindergarten will be by appointment only. Appointments may be made by calling the Asa Adams School at 866-2151 between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.

Children eligible for Pre-Kindergarten must be 4 years of age on or before October 15, 2015. Enrollment will be limited and students will be accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis. There will be a morning and afternoon session lasting approximately 2-1/2 hours each.

Children eligible for Kindergarten must be 5 years of age on or before October 15, 2015. Kindergarten is a full day program.

A legal birth certificate, immunization record and 2 forms of residency verification are necessary in completing the registration forms. It is not necessary for parents to bring their children to the registration. Screening and parent orientation will be held later.

WPCF NEWS

Let's get something straight; nothing besides toilet paper and human waste should ever be flushed down the toilet. This includes: paper towels, feminine hygiene products, dead gold fish and most importantly, baby wipes. It has become clear that many people aren't aware of this and it's causing a lot of trouble for sewer systems across America.

Unfortunately, not even "flushable" bathroom wipes are safe enough to flush down the toilet. These wipes may go down the toilet when you hit the flush lever, but experts say once in the sewer system, they don't break down.

Since 2009, waste water treatment officials across the country have seen a rising tide of sewer backups, pump breakdowns and overflows caused by wipes that are marketed as flushable.

When you dump household grease down the sink it flows into the sewer system and congeals. It might make it out of your own service line only to start blocking the

main sewer. Add the grease and the baby wipes together and you get a recipe for a "fatberg". London sewer workers found a 15-ton ball of grease and wipes clogging up the system

that took 3 weeks to break up. This is a worst case scenario, but it's something to think about. When the sewer main gets plugged, raw sewerage backs up, possibly into your home.

LANDFILL DROP OFF

(continued from front page)

Acceptable items include:

- ◆ Household and furniture items (**NO** TVs, monitors, batteries, fluorescent tubes or computers)
- ◆ Boards, debris, metal (items must be separated at the landfill)
- ◆ Non-freon white goods (i.e. stoves, microwaves, cabinets)

The only charge for residents during this week is the \$20/item fee for items containing freon (i.e. refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers and air conditioners) which must be obtained from the Town Office prior to drop-off at the landfill.

No tires, auto engines or car bodies can be dropped off. However, up to two tires (without rims) can be placed curbside with your weekly trash pickup.

LEAVES AND BRUSH ACCEPTED AT THE LANDFILL

The Town of Orono now accepts leaves and brush at the landfill at **no charge**. Residents **must** have a free permit to haul brush and bagged leaves to the landfill during regular operating hours. Materials must be dumped in the designated area as directed by Public Works staff. No contaminated materials will be accepted. Contact Public Works or the Town Office with any questions.

RECYCLING MAGNETS

Recycling schedule magnets are available at the town office.

LANDFILL REGULAR HOURS - MARCH 25TH

Beginning March 25, 2015, the landfill will return to the standard hours of operation - every Wednesday & Saturday from 8:00am-4:00pm.
