2016 DOG LICENSES ARE AVAILABLE



Renewal due by December 31st annually

Maine Law requires that all dogs six months of age or older be licensed in the municipality where their owners reside within two weeks of ownership. Dog licenses for the year 2016 are now available at the town office. To avoid the additional mandatory late fee of \$25.00, dogs must be registered at the Town Office by Friday, January 29, 2016. The fee for a spayed or neutered dog is \$6.00 and \$11.00 for an unaltered dog and residents should bring a copy of a recent rabies certificate.



HOLIDAY TREE PICKUP

Public Works will be picking up holiday trees curbside for **two weeks**, beginning Monday, January 4th through Friday, January 15th.

Please leave your trees out during this time period and the Public Works crew will circulate around town picking them up during their regular working hours.

UPDATED COMPREHENSIVE PLAN ADOPTED

The Town Council unanimously adopted the updated Orono Comprehensive Plan at its November 9th meeting.

The updated plan was two years in the making under the guidance of the Comprehensive Plan Committee. The Committee, chaired by Phil Ruck, met 25 times, held five well attended public forums and a public hearing. The Town Council then reviewed and edited the plan and sought additional public comment on the final version.

The second half of property taxes will be due on Friday, February 12, 2016 for the fiscal year July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016. Please mark your calendars. The interest rate on unpaid taxes is 7%. Interest begins on February 13, 2016.



The Orono Beautification Committee would like to announce the winner of its First Annual Window Box and Container Contest. The University Inn on College Avenue in Orono has been presented the 2015 Garden Trowel Award. Large containers filled with a mix of annuals lined the entryway parking lot. Huge, red dragon wing begonias were the primary focus. Smaller containers filled with a variety of tropical plants were displayed on either side of the lobby doors and window boxes with annuals graced the roofed entrance of the building.

Tracey Whitten, owner of the University Inn and the Black Bear Inn, will display the plaque in the lobby. WINTER SCHEDULE AT LANDFILL

The Landfill is now open! During the months of December 2015 through March 2016, the Town of Orono Landfill will have limited hours of operation.

The Landfill will be open to permit holders on **Saturdays from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM** on the following dates:

- December 5, 19**
- January 2, 16, 30**
- February 13, 27**
- March 12, 26**

The landfill will also be available to permit holders on Wednesdays **by appointment only** at no additional charge. Appointments can be made by contacting Rob Yerxa or Ken Beylerian Monday through Friday between the hours of 7:00 AM and 3:30 PM at 866-5062. Appointments will be taken at the discretion of the Public Works Department contingent on staffing levels and weather considerations.

Beginning April 4, 2015, the landfill will return to the standard hours of operation — every Wednesday and Saturday from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM. As always, the landfill is available to be opened on unscheduled days, by appointment only, for an additional charge.

WINTER PARKING BAN IN EFFECT

The Town of Orono has a “parking ban” from November 1 to April 15. Motor vehicles must be parked in off-street locations between 12 midnight and 8:00 am. During a major snow storm, the Public Works Department has to plow the streets in the daytime. Vehicles in residential areas are required to be parked off street at these times to aid in snow removal. If owners of motor vehicles do not comply, they can be fined from \$10 to \$100 each day or vehicles can be towed.

LEAVES AND BRUSH ACCEPTED AT LANDFILL

The Town of Orono now accepts leaves and brush at the landfill. Residents with a FREE permit may haul brush and bagged leaves to the landfill during regular operating hours. *(See the winter landfill schedule)*

Obtain your free leaves/brush permit at the Town Office during regular business hours, Monday-Friday, 8:30am-4:30pm to take to the landfill.

Materials must be dumped in the designated area as directed by Public Works staff. No contaminated materials will be accepted.

POLICE DEPARTMENT ROAD SAFETY

As winter is upon us, the Orono Police Department would like to remind people of the following information:

- Be aware of black ice and snow covered roads.
- Make sure you have good tires and remember to put on your studded snow tires.
- Make sure to clean the snow off all your windows before driving on the roadways.
- Do not over drive road conditions. Slow down and pay attention to your speed.
- Be aware of snow plows (you may see them, but they may not see you).
- Pay attention to pedestrian traffic and children playing on snow banks.
- Check your windshield wipers and replace if needed.

ARE YOU INTERESTED IN WORKING AT THE POLLS?

In an effort to increase the call list of trained Election staff for the upcoming 2016 Primary and Presidential Elections, our office is soliciting all persons who have an interest in working during the 2016 Election season. This is a great time to get out, see the community in action and be connected to democracy!

Qualifications include being at least 17 years of age, US Citizen, registered voter of Orono and enrolled in one of the major parties. These are paid positions and training is included!

HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION

is for everyone if...
you answer yes to:

- Are you a resident of the State of Maine?
- Will you have owned a home in the State of Maine for at least the past 12 months prior to April 1, 2016?
- Do you declare your home in Orono as your permanent place of residency?

If you answered yes to all of these questions, you may be entitled to a \$15,000 reduction in the assessed value of your home, regardless of your income. The exemption is being increased in 2016 from \$10,000 to \$15,000. If you currently receive the \$10,000 Homestead Exemption, you do NOT need to do anything, you will automatically receive the \$15,000 exemption.

VETERAN EXEMPTION

If you are a veteran, at least age 62 or 100% disabled, a resident of Orono and served during a federally recognized war period, you may qualify for a \$6,000 reduction in the assessed value of your property. Widows of veterans may also qualify for a reduction.

**You must apply
by April 1, 2016**

If you believe that you may qualify for either a veteran or homestead exemption, you must apply by April 1, 2016 in order to receive the exemption(s) on your September 2016 tax bill. Check your current tax bill to see if you are receiving these exemptions. If you are, there is no need to reapply. If you are not, you may obtain applications at the Town Office.

BIG GIG OPENS 4TH SEASON WITH A WINNER

Got a painful skin problem from a burn or shingles or warts? Soon you may be able to get relief from a lobster product – LobsteRx healing cream – developed by Orono-based startup Lobster Unlimited, LLC.

Lobster Unlimited won the first Big Gig event of 2015-16, held at University Credit Union (UCU) headquarters in Downtown Orono, with its pitch for getting the healing cream to market in 2016.

The company discovered unique biological properties in lobster hemolymph (a fluid in invertebrates such as lobsters) that make it “a totally new and highly effective healing skin cream.” The hemolymph is a throw-away item at lobster processing plants and thus the unexpected raw material for a value added product from Maine’s iconic seafood.

The team of Cathy Billings, Dr. Bob Bayer, and Matthew Hodgkins were awarded the \$250 first prize and qualified for the pitch-off finale in April 2016. Two other pitches also impressed the judges and audience:

- Husson student Philip Frost’s travel platform designed to connect tourists with local tour guides; and
- The Kindness Project partner Andrea Beaulieu’s pitch for a new program aimed at rescuing food and supplies “from trash to table.”

The second Big Gig event is Dec. 9 at Yama’s Bar & Grill in Old Town; the third will be Feb. 10 at Husson University Dyke Family Center; and the finale on Apr. 13 at UMaine’s Foster Center for Student Innovation. Go to www.bigbig.org for details, including how to sign up

Big Gig is a partnership of Orono Economic Development Corp., University of Maine, Old Town Development LLC, and Husson University. It is sponsored by OEDC, Eaton Peabody, and Blackstone Accelerates Growth, with the prize money provided by UCU.
