2017 DOG LICENSES ARE AVAILABLE



Renewal due by December 31st annually

Maine Law requires that all dogs six months of age or older be licensed in the municipality where their owners reside within two weeks of ownership. Dog licenses for the year 2017 are now available at the town office. To avoid the additional mandatory late fee of \$25.00, dogs must be registered at the Town Office by Tuesday, January 31, 2017. The fee for a spayed or neutered dog is \$6.00 and \$11.00 for an unaltered dog and residents should bring a copy of a recent rabies certificate.



HOLIDAY TREE PICKUP

Public Works will be picking up holiday trees curbside for **two weeks**, beginning Tuesday, January 3rd through Friday, January 13th.

Please leave your trees out during this time period and the Public Works crew will circulate around town picking them up during their regular working hours.

SEWER RATES INCREASE JANUARY 1

The minimum standards for Residential and Commercial Sewer accounts billed on a quarterly basis will see a slight increase beginning on January 1, 2017.

The minimum standard charge for town sewer will increase from \$54.48 to \$55.20 per 1,200 cubic feet which equals 72 cents. For unmetered service, the minimum charge per quarter shall remain the same at \$86.26 per 1,900 cubic feet.

2ND-HALF PROPERTY TAXES DUE FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 10TH

The second half of property taxes will be due on Friday, February 10, 2017 for the fiscal year July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017. Please mark your calendars.

The interest rate on unpaid taxes is 7%. Interest begins on February 11, 2017.

MUNICIPAL ELECTION NOMINATION PAPERS AVAILABLE

Nomination papers will be available after December 19th at the town office for the March 14, 2017 Municipal Election. The deadline for filing papers is on or before 4:30 p.m. Friday, January 27, 2017. At least 25, but no more than 100, signatures of Orono voters are required to have a name placed on the ballot. WINTER SCHEDULE AT LANDFILL

The Landfill is now open! During the months of December 2016 through March 2017, the Town of Orono Landfill will have limited hours of operation.

The Landfill will be open to permit holders on **Saturdays from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM** on the following dates:

December	3, 17
January	7, 21
February	4, 18
March	4, 18

The landfill will also be available to permit holders on Wednesdays **by appointment only** at no additional charge. Appointments can be made by contacting Rob Yerxa or Ken Beylerian Monday through Friday between the hours of 7:00 AM and 3:30 PM at 866-5062. Appointments will be taken at the discretion of the Public Works Department contingent on staffing levels and weather considerations.

Beginning April 5, 2017, the landfill will return to the standard hours of operation — every Wednesday and Saturday from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM. As always, the landfill is available to be opened on unscheduled days, by appointment only, for an additional charge.

WINTER PARKING BAN IN EFFECT

The Town of Orono has a “parking ban” from November 1 to April 15. Motor vehicles must be parked in off-street locations between 12 midnight and 8:00 am. During a major snow storm, the Public Works Department has to plow the streets in the daytime. Vehicles in residential areas are required to be parked off street at these times to aid in snow removal. If owners of motor vehicles do not comply, they can be fined from \$10 to \$100 each day or vehicles can be towed.



LEAVES AND BRUSH ACCEPTED AT LANDFILL

The Town of Orono now accepts leaves and brush at the landfill. Residents with a FREE permit may haul brush and bagged leaves to the landfill during regular operating hours. *(See the winter landfill schedule)*

Obtain your free leaves/brush permit at the Town Office during regular business hours, Monday-Friday, 8:30am-4:30pm to take to the landfill.

Materials must be dumped in the designated area as directed by Public Works staff. No contaminated materials will be accepted.

**RE-REGISTERING
YOUR MOTOR
VEHICLE SOON?**

Just a friendly reminder that if you are heading out to the Town Office to re-register your motor vehicle a few items which will speed up your service include: **a previous yellow registration copy, valid insurance card and the recent mileage.**

Don't forget our office only handles cash and check transactions at this time – so you will need to plan accordingly.

BLIND EXEMPTION

If you are legally blind you may be eligible for a \$4,000 reduction in the assessed value of your property. Certification from your doctor is required along with a completed application.

Applications are available at the Town Office.

**HOMESTEAD
EXEMPTION
is for everyone if...
you answer yes to:**

- Are you a resident of the State of Maine?
- Will you have owned a home in the State of Maine for at least the past 12 months prior to April 1, 2017?
- Do you declare your home in Orono as your permanent place of residency?

If you answered yes to all of these questions, you may be entitled to a \$20,000 reduction in the assessed value of your home, regardless of your income. The exemption is being increased in 2017 from \$15,000 to \$20,000. If you currently receive the \$15,000 Homestead Exemption, you do NOT need to do anything, you will automatically receive the \$20,000 exemption.

**VETERAN
EXEMPTION**

If you are a veteran, at least age 62 or 100% disabled, a resident of Orono and served during a federally recognized war period, you may qualify for a \$6,000 reduction in the assessed value of your property. Widows of veterans may also qualify for a reduction.

**You must apply
by April 1, 2017**

If you believe that you may qualify for either a blind, veteran or homestead exemption, you must apply by April 1, 2017 in order to receive the exemption(s) on your September 2017 tax bill. Check your current tax bill to see if you are receiving these exemptions. If you are, there is no need to reapply. If you are not, you may obtain applications at the Town Office.
